

## **TSWALU INFORMATION 2023**

Tswalu Kalahari Reserve, a vast tract of the southern Kalahari in the Northern Cape, is at the forefront of sustainable ecotourism in South Africa. As a fellow member of The Long Run, our sustainability journey is focused on the four key areas of conservation, community, culture and commerce. The reserve is first and foremost an ambitious conservation project that funds numerous research projects, geared towards understanding and conserving key species within the Kalahari ecosystem. Research informs all major conservation decisions, playing a vital role in revealing fascinating aspects of the ecology. Tswalu has always taken a low-impact, high-value approach to ecotourism - the reserve has the lowest guest footprint in South Africa - and revenue from Motse camp and Tarkuni homestead helps fund conservation. Ecotourism contributes to the sustainable preservation of the southern Kalahari's biodiversity for future generations.

IMPACT STATEMENT	Tswalu recently released its first impact statement, a new tool developed in collaboration with The Long Run to calculate the cost of operating sustainably while also measuring the positive impact on local communities and the environment. The blueprint for the impact statement was conceived by The Long Run in response to an increased demand among travellers for credible data around environmental issues together with a desire for greener travel.  Being transparent about where the money goes will hopefully provide our guests with a better understanding of the cost of conservation and what it takes to operate sustainably. By staying with us, our guests help conserve 114,000 hectares and impact the lives of 282 residents. In addition, in 2021 nature-based tourism helped us provide essential health care to 991 people through the Tswalu clinic, a free community service to anyone within a 100-kilometre radius of the reserve. In 2021, Tswalu invested USD 5.779 million in nature and people. ZAR 9 240 One way ZAR 18 480 Return  Johannesburg to Tswalu (flying time – 1.5 hours) Flight departs from Fireblade Aviation, ORTIA, at 13h00 Flight departs from Tswalu at 10h20  Cape Town to Tswalu (flying time – 2 hours ) Flight departs from Execujet Hangar, CTIA, at 12h00 Flight departs from Tswalu at 14h50  Please note that luggage (must be soft sided bags) is restricted to a maximum of 44 pounds (20 kg) on Tswalu scheduled flights, inclusive hand luggage. Extra seats may be purchased, at standard rates, should guests wish to travel with excess luggage (will allow for 50 kg / 110 pounds extra in soft sided bags). Complimentary storage facilities are available for excess luggage in both Cape Town and Johannesburg.
