

OUR INVESTMENT IN THE 4Cs

	88%	CONSERVATION	The cost of conserving a private reserve, including habitat restoration, land and wildlife management, and security, is our sole responsibility.
	7%	COMMUNITY	A fully equipped and staffed health care centre provides services to staff and anyone in need within a 100km radius of the reserve; Tshameka Preschool offers ECD for staff children 2-6 years.
	5%	RESEARCH	The Tswalu Foundation supports environmental research projects, often with a climate change focus, that not only inform reserve management but contribute to the greater conservation community.

THE POSITIVE IMPACT OF YOUR STAY

CONSERVATION	Restoration of over 50 ecologically degraded farms, bringing habitats back into balance, increasing biodiversity, and successfully reintroducing rare and endangered species - species count includes 80 mammals, 239 birds, and 292 plants. Carbon neutral status since 2019.
COMMUNITY	In 2023, a total of 5878 patients visited the health care centre; Khutsong, a staf recreational centre was opened, including a gym and shop selling fresh produce.



Preservation of historic rock art sites; ongoing archaeological research through the Tswalu Foundation; hosting artists through the Artists in Residence programme (a percentage of exhibition proceeds donated to the foundation).



The positive impact of nature-based tourism added US\$6 million for the benefit of people and the planet, developing the local economy and providing employment (58% of staff drawn from the Northern Cape).
